A motion was made by Ward and seconded by Livingston to vote to employ Jeff Marshall as Assistant Elementary Principal/Tribal Liaison per Superintendent's recommendation for the 2021-2022 school year. Livingston-yes, Mooney-yes, Royce-yes, Scott-yes, and Ward-yes

A motion was made by Ward and seconded by Livingston to vote to employ Kyle Vanderburg as Middle School Principal per Superintendent's recommendation for the 2021-2022 school year. Livingston-yes, Mooney-yes, Royce-yes, Scott-yes, and Ward-yes

A motion was made by Livingston and seconded by Mooney to vote to employ Gary Lay as High School Principal per Superintendent's recommendation for the 2021-2022 school year. Livingston-yes, Mooney-yes, Royce-yes, Scott-yes, and Ward-yes

A motion was made by Ward and seconded by Livingston to approve out of state travel for the High School Cheerleaders to Hot Springs, Arkansas and the High School Boys Basketball Team to Branson, Missouri as requested. Livingston-yes, Mooney-yes, Royce-yes, Scott-yes, and Ward-yes

A motion was made by Ward and seconded by Livingston to approve the fund raisers as presented by WHS Wrestling, FCCLA and Cheerleaders. Livingston-yes, Mooney-yes, Royce-yes, Scott-yes, and Ward-yes

A motion was made by Mooney and seconded by Livingston to approve contract service with Total Rehab for Speech Therapy, Physical Therapy, Occupation Therapy and Sensory Start Services for the 2021-2022 school year. Livingston-yes, Mooney-yes, Royce-yes, Scott-yes, and Ward-yes

Dr. Butler presented the following under Superintendent's report:

1) legislative update which includes sad news for public education (a. takes away 3rd year of consideration on funding formula but does allow larger carryover, and 2) transfer guidance be rewritten and numbers will be established by local boards

2) Nurse McAlester provided an update on the COVID numbers impacting our school, city, and county. She reported that at least 50% of our faculty have started and/or finished the vaccination process with several having to wait 90 days post COVID to vaccinate. 57 students were tested curbside. Life Skills/Pax grants will aid struggling students.

3) Administrators will discuss options for school next year. End of year numbers will be compiled.

4) Principal's report: Jacob Lowe – chromebooks are in and waiting for charging carts to be set up and ready to go. No quarantines or positives at the elementary and is so

thankful for that. Students are so grateful to be in school at this point. SPED testing to begin tomorrow. Choctaw Nation Summer to start May 24 and run through June 25, 2021. Theme will be Superheroes in training. Kelly Phillips outlined purpose of the PAX grant which is to help students build self esteem in a fun way that involves a lot of interaction between the kids; tootles and tattles...

Jeff Marshall – the climate was different after returning from spring break, everyone was excited to be returning to the classroom which provides a nice environment for everyone! Kyle Vanderburg – Middle School is busy with end of year activities, dance tonight, track meet tomorrow, baseball, softball, track, golf all participating in events. Testing starts the 12th. MS will have different themes for the kids to participate in. Bids being received from contractors for repairs from ice storm damage.

Gary Lay – April/May calendar at the High School involves something nearly every day and/or evening. Academic Banquet on 4/27, Arts on the Lawn to be presented (weather permitting or in the HS gymnasium), Baccalaureate, Froshmore Academic Team qualified for State, track teams having success, boy's and girl's golf in full swing, OYE complete, Blue and Gold sales winding down, 18' projector screen for auditorium has arrived, feeding students taking the ACT, at this point 95% have tested already. Mr. Lay expressed his thanks to the board for their support and said it had been his honor to graduate from WHS and to now work here.

Under new business a motion was made by Mooney and seconded by Ward to approve payment to OSDE Child Nutrition for \$37,438.29 in order to receive \$44,764.42 to correct an underpayment. Livingston-yes, Mooney-yes, Royce-yes, Scott-yes, and Ward-yes

Also, under new business, a motion was made by Mooney and seconded by Livingston to approve the purchase of materials for awning covering at the elementary (use of ESSER funds with pre-approval) for \$24,004.96. Livingston-yes, Mooney-yes, Royce-yes, Scott-yes, and Ward-yes
